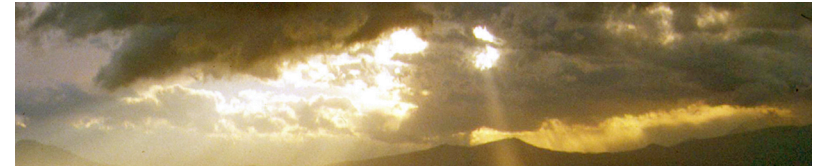
*In memory of Jesus the Christ,
